The 1-102nd CAV is currently underway for our mobilization process. We are training on a daily basis on improving our tactical and technical proficiencies. Each day is as challenging as the next but we are working as a team, most importantly as a family, to complete our tasks in order to mobilize to Southwest Asia and Africa. The time thus far spent in Texas has been targeted towards acclimating to the environment, getting Soldiers finances and medical needs addressed and working as a unified front out on the lanes to enhance our maneuver operations.

When the 1-102nd touched ground in Texas the atmosphere was that of excitement. Finally, the moment was here! But there was still training to be done. ## Squadron Colors Unfurled in Jordan.

"Black Stetson hats, adorned with golden crossed sabers, dotted a crowd of cavalrymen sitting quietly inside a small auditorium, awaiting the moment that for some, symbolized the official end to their unit's mission and for others, the beginning.

In a ceremony at the Joint Training Center in Jordan, the California National Guard's 1st Squadron, 18th Cavalry Regiment (1-18 CAV) relinquished authority of their mission to the New Jersey National Guard's 1st Squadron, 102nd Cavalry Regiment (1-102 CAV), March 14, 2019.

The 1-18 CAV finishes their rotation under Operation Spartan Shield which started July of 2018 and included security, unit readiness and partnering with the Jordanian Armed Forces (JAF) to enhance border security. "I stand here humbled and thankful for the incredible opportunity we were presented and the extraordinary hospitality and graciousness of our Jordanian hosts," said LTC Jeremy T. Hopkins, commander of 1-18 CAV, speaking to an audience of U.S Army and Jordan Armed Forces soldiers.

Hopkins spoke about his Soldiers' accomplishments and the partnership they developed with JAF Border Guard Force.

"The Soldiers have performed the important mission of providing security for key facilities and improving readiness," said Hopkins. "They also built relationships with the Jordan Armed Forces and coalition partners. We built those bonds with our Jordanian partners by working side by side through the heat, the cold, the rain and through challenges as we trained to prepare units to secure the borders of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan from those that would do it harm."

A significant portion of the 1-18 CAV's mission was working with the Border Guard Force through the Jordan Operation Engagement Program (JOEP), the most extensive training program funded by the Counter Terrorism Partnership Fund.



It focuses on regional security, partnership building, and enhancing the Jordan Armed Forces' capability to better defend their country against ISIS and any other violent extremist organizations that may threaten the safety of its people.

Throughout nine months, the 1-18 CAV worked closely with four Border Guard Force battalions, at one point putting two battalions through the 10-week JOEP simultaneously. During those 10-weeks, the squadron helped Border Guard Force battalions develop their soldier's basic, squad and platoon level skills as well their specialty teams such as medics, indirect fire infantrymen, snipers, and forward observers.

Now a new chapter begins as the 1-102 CAV moves forward to where the 1-18 CAV leaves off. "As the largest single unit under the Jordanian Operational Engagement Program, or JOEP, we are proud to continue the great work of the 1-18 CAV," said LTC Omar T. Minott, commander of the 1-102 CAV. Minott went on to thank 1-18 CAV and its leadership for the zeal and neighborliness they demonstrated in helping the 1-120 CAV prepare for their mission and for leaving JOEP on a solid foundation for success. After nine months Soldiers of the 1-18 CAV are ready to go back home to their families and loved ones but will undoubtedly remember their time spent in Jordan and working the JAF.

Hopkins ended his speech, sharing his experiences to the incoming unit.

"It's now time for us to turn the mission over to the 1-102 CAV's Lt. Col Minott," said Hopkins. "I know your squadron has the capabilities and desire to take the Jordan Operational Engagement program and the overall mission to the next level. There's hard work still to be done, and I know your soldiers are committed Jordan's security and continued success. The days will be full but time will pass quickly, and the friendships you build will last a lifetime." As we move forward, we continue the ongoing process of arranging our display cases depicting the history of our unit. We have now completed the eight display cases that are located in the back room and are arranging the items to be on display in the front area cases.

Additionally, we are still holding workshops from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM almost every Wednesday to continue the remaining milestones of sorting, categorizing, logging, and labeling all items for accountability. We are in need of more help; and if you would like to be a part of this historical effort, please contact Frank Mnich or COL Bill Morris. We would gladly welcome your assistance and place you on our Heritage Room Committee and our workshop e-mail listing.

### **UPDATED - ONGOING and COMPLETED PROJECTS AND RENOVATIONS:**

- \* Our German Nazi Flag has been reframed professionally and is now hung on the right outside wall in the back room. We are in the process of working on a narrative that will be presented on a citation next to the flag to explain its remembrance and importance to our association. Additionally, it will then be moved to another location which will better display the flag along with the citation explaining the amazing story behind it.
- \* As noted in the winter edition of the Spur, we are still working on having the entire electrical wiring system above the drop ceiling redone because it needs to be reinstalled in accordance to the current state electrical code. When completed, the state electrician will inspect the work for code approval.
- \* The Heritage Room floors had been earmarked to be renovated with laminate floor covering; but unfortunately, this cannot be accomplished at this time. However, in the meantime we are anticipating doing a heavy striping of the bar area floor and polishing it to a high gloss shine by buffing it afterwards.
- \* We are still awaiting a status from our full time Armorer, who has submitted MAJ Harty's request to have a professional contractor clean the outside of all the building's windows.
- \* We are presently in the process of sorting out and categorizing many loose pictures. We will then proceed to further organize them for easier identification and accountability.
- \* Lastly, we have taken on another project to overhaul all the wooden barstools as most of them no longer turn or have major issues with their safety structure.
- \* As always, I thank all members who continue to make the effort and find time to come out and help at our workshops. Please come out to meetings to participate and help with fresh ideas that affect our decision making so we can ALL "Show 'Em The Way" together.

8 Feb 2019

The meeting began with Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

President Mahon recognized Ronnie Nier and Rochus Lawrence for their attendance. Ronnie Nier travelled three hours to attend the meeting.

All the units of the 1/102 Cavalry have been deployed to training in Texas and will be deployed overseas. HHT and two troops will be deployed to Jordan, one troop to Somalia and one troop to Kosovo.

The president recognized the fantastic job that Danielle and the Family Readiness Group did in helping with the deployment. Over 2000 pre-deployment family photos were taken. Union County has been very supportive of the military and its members.

Essex Troop Association meetings are a lot of fun. The highlight of the last meeting was Eisenhower's driver giving out his homemade soap. It is an opportunity to experience "history sitting next to us".

Heritage Room Update: We are still in the process of updating the display cases. The electrical in the ceiling is not up to code and is being worked on by Art Maggs. New flooring has been put on hold for the foreseeable future. The plan is to strip and wax the current tile floor. We may be getting new windows as the state renovates the armories.

The Heritage Room has been getting more traffic because LTC Minot and BG Chrystal have been talking about our heritage. They have also been lending out vehicles to connect to the community. However, it should be a lot quieter now that the units have deployed.

The family readiness group will be involved in many different programs. They will be operating as a 501(c) organization to advocate for veterans, the Squadron, the 42 Brigade and the NJARNG. They will be initiating a care package drive to send to deployed Troops. Ground coffee is especially appreciated. COL(Ret) Dougherty acknowledged the contributions of the Westfield Dinner and other Greek Diners in the area for generously donating a deuce and a half worth of care packages. There are about 300 members on the roster but only 57 members have paid their dues so that we are spending money that we are not bringing in. Minutes from last meeting were accepted.

President's remarks President Mahon wanted to thank all the old members and the new members for coming to the meeting. He also wanted to recognize that the squadron commander LTC Minot finally was promoted to lieutenant colonel. President Mahon recommends that everyone read the account of LT Jennifer Wayne, the acting PAO, of the troops in Jordan. If anyone has any stories of interest please send them to MAJ Bailey so that they can be published in The Spur. The Spur also contains membership forms and information on becoming a Spur Booster. The membership forms can be emailed directly to Daniel Mahon and Chris Sands.

Becoming a Spur Booster helps to defray the costs of printing and mailing The Spur.

Webmaster John Crescenzi has put up a new website. The password will be coming in the future. Heritage Room Update Mr Mnich began his remarks by welcoming everyone to help out by coming to a meeting on most Wednesdays between one and five o'clock. Dan Mahon and Don Kondrosky have been working on the displays. Art Maggs has been working on bringing the electrical work in the ceiling up to state code and hopefully will be done by the end of June. We want to avoid the loss experienced in Sea Girt when the General's Cottage caught fire due to bad electrical wiring. The rug in the back of the heritage room was shampooed and molding was applied to the wall. Plans to replace the floor have been put on hold and the current floor will be stripped and waxed. The bar stool swivel plates were also replaced to restore smooth movement to the swiveling of the bar stools. In gratitude, the association voted to recompense your secretary for his outlays in purchasing the bar stool swivels. The state plans to replace the windows.

Treasurer's report The starting total \$13,876.00. Deposits of \$1,004 were made. Interest was a \$1.22. Check 697 was for refreshments totaling \$68. Check 698 was for the spur of postage \$172.00. Check 699 was \$75 for pizza. Check 700 was \$375 to print The Spur. Checks 701 and 702 were voided. Check 703 was \$792 for Heritage Room repairs and repair parts. The total is \$14,408.00 in the checking account. Family Support Report Daniella is celebrating her 10th year with 102 Cavalry Family Readiness Group (FRG). HHT, A Troop and B Troop are in Jordan. C troop is in Somalia.

The troops are running their own family support programs in their respective armories. The FRG also runs a few squadron wide programs in Westfield because there is a lot of local support. On April 28 the FRG ran a Sunday Funday to have kids and families pack care packages for the troops. The non-profit Bonds of Courage will use

proceeds from casino night to pay for shipping. On 18May19 the Yellow Ribbon Association will host an open house from 1300 to 1500 hrs to allow members of the Community to tour the armory and the heritage room. The 10th Annual Casino night will be Saturday November 23, 2019. President Mahon wants the Cavalry Association to be an active partner with the Family Readiness Group.

Old Business and New Business Suggestions for displaying items in the heritage room would be greatly appreciated and welcomed. Discussion was begun on whether to continue having meetings on Friday Nights or to consider occasional Saturday and Sunday afternoon or evenings. It was also suggested that we could have a picnic and call it a meeting. The Association will be setting up a Pay pal or Vimeo account to make payments easier because younger members do not carry checkbooks. Past President Dennis Dougherty would like to send books to deployed members of the squadron. A motion was proposed and passed to pay for the postage. President Mahon asks that all members go on Facebook and friend the family support group. Each troop has their own page. If any members were active during 9/11 they should contact President Mahon to be included World Trade Center Medical Study. The troops in Jordan wanted to get the 102 Association hats so 80 were ordered and shipped directly. The hats will be provided at cost. Spurs and Sabers will be a smaller affair this year due to the deployment of the troops. Plans are being considered to have an in armory affair. Closing remarks President Mahon wished everyone a Happy Easter. He also reminded them to pay their taxes on April 15. # **Memorial Day 2019**

"A Memorial Day Proclamation Prayer for Peace, Memorial Day Since war is the world's most terrible scourge, we should do all in our power to prevent its recurrence. It was the hope of mankind that with the cessation of hostilities of World War II the way would be open to founding a permanent peace. Instead, that war has left the world in a state of continued unrest. Accordingly, we feel the need of turning in humble suppliance to Almighty God for help and guidance. In recognition of this need, the Congress has fittingly provided, in a joint resolution

which I approved on May 11, 1950, that Memorial Day, which has long been set aside for paying tribute to those who lost their lives in war, shall henceforth be dedicated also as a day for Nation-wide prayer for permanent peace. The Congress has also requested that the President issue a proclamation calling upon the people of the United States to observe Memorial Day in that manner. NOW, THEREFORE, I, HARRY S. TRUMAN, President of the United States of America, pursuant to the aforementioned resolution, do hereby proclaim Memorial Day, Tuesday, May 30, 1950, and each succeeding Memorial Day, as a day of prayer for permanent peace. And I designate the hour beginning at eleven o'clock in the morning of that day, Eastern Daylight Saving Time, as a period in which all our people may unite in prayer, each in accordance with his own religious faith, for divine aid in bringing enduring peace to a troubled world." HARRY S. TRUMAN, President of the United States
